

Pony Rides

Pony rides are offered for children ages 3–10 who are under 4'6" and less than 100 lbs. An adult must be present during the ride, and cameras are welcome. Rides last 15 minutes and are led by a staff member. They are done on a first-come, first-served basis Fridays 4-5:30 pm and Saturdays 11 am–12:30 pm only.

Party with the Ponies

Parties may consist of 3-12 children ages 5-10 years (height and weight of less than 4'6" and under 100 lbs). The two-hour party package (Saturdays or Sundays 2-4 pm) includes exclusive use of the clubroom and pony rides led by staff members. You provide the food, beverages, paper goods and adult supervision for children in the clubroom.

Residents \$250/Non-Residents \$350

Parties must be booked at least two weeks in advance and scheduling is subject to availability. Full payment is required to reserve a date. A \$50 cancellation fee will be retained if party is cancelled within one week of date.

Boarding

Boarding for horses is offered and includes a quality feed program, six-day-a-week stall cleaning, turn-out weather permitting, small trail access, tack rooms, indoor wash rack with hot and cold water, and a heated/air conditioned clubroom with restrooms.

Scout Badge Programs

Girl and Boy Scouts can earn their horse fun and horsemanship badges.

Gift Certificates

Gift certificates for riding lessons are available and valid for 60 days from date of purchase.

Long pants and sturdy shoes/boots with a ½-inch heel are recommended when riding. Open-toed/open-heeled shoes are prohibited. Riding helmets are required and provided by the center if rider does not have one. Damage to helmets or tack will be billed to the rider.

**General
Information**

The Normantown Trails Equestrian Center is a 6-acre facility on Normantown Road, just south of 119th Street.

The center features a 78x180 foot indoor heated riding arena with an observation area for parents and guests, a small indoor riding arena, two large outdoor riding arenas, and five paddocks. The stable has forty-eight 11x12 foot stalls and includes an indoor wash rack as well as a clubroom/classroom.

The Normantown Trails Equestrian Center is the result of a unique cooperative venture of the Plainfield Park District and developer Fry Properties, Inc. With the development of the White Ash Farm subdivision, Fry envisioned a renovation of the stable and worked with the Park District to make the center possible.

"While equestrian programming is common to park districts, the actual owning and operation of an equestrian center by a park district is unique," said Plainfield Park District Executive Director Greg Bott. "The Plainfield Park District has been very encouraged by the public interest in this facility, and we are proud to provide such an excellent recreational opportunity for the people of our community."

Winter/Spring '08 Group Lessons

The Normantown Trails Equestrian Center offers group instruction for riders of all ages and levels in English, Western, Dressage and Hunter-Jumper. The center has several school horses and lesson ponies to accommodate beginners as well as more advanced riders. Teaching methods include videos, handouts, mounted and dismounted demonstrations and hands-on experiences. Levels are repeated until skills are mastered. To ensure placement in the correct riding class, an evaluation lesson may be scheduled. There is a \$35 resident fee/\$40 non-resident fee for this evaluation lesson. There are no make-ups for missed lessons.

Beginner Group Lessons – Ages 8-18

Participants will learn how to approach, lead, mount, dismount, groom and tack a horse/pony and begin to learn the gaits of walk, trot and canter. Riders will be exposed to both English and Western riding styles. First session will not include riding.

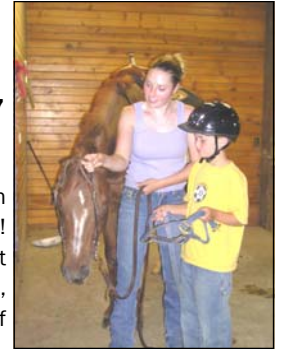
